In 2025, HFMN continued to expand our impact across Colorado. This Annual Report highlights the breadth of our work and the difference we are making thanks to the generosity of our donors.

Last year, HFMN assisted more than 5,400 service members, veterans, and their family members, responding to over 18,000 calls for assistance when help was needed most. Thanks to the generosity of our community, we provided more than \$230,000 in emergency financial assistance, helping HFMN clients navigate unexpected hardships and regain stability.

Our partner network grew in 2025. We welcomed six new organizations, expanding our network to 57 trusted partners. Together, they provide a broad range of services to address the diverse needs of our military and veteran communities. Through this network, we foster collaboration and communication to reduce duplication and fragmentation of services, ensuring those in need can access support quickly – ideally before they reach a crisis.

In 2025, we also expanded our outreach efforts to ensure service members, veterans, and their families are aware of the many resources available to them so that they may receive benefits they have earned. Through outreach events across Colorado, HFMN connected with more than 14,000 individuals. For those who feel overwhelmed or are unsure where to begin, our case management team provides personalized navigation support for as long as needed, helping individuals and families overcome challenges and thrive.

OUR MISSION



Our mission is to connect military service members, veterans, and their families to resources offered by our trusted community partners and to provide emergency financial assistance.

We connect them to essential resources, including emergency financial assistance provided by HFMN and our partners, to meet the full range of needs of individuals and families, following alongside them every step of the way, helping them stand on their own and thrive.

HFMN coordinates a network of community service providers, facilitating collaboration and collective impact and providing training for military, VA, and community partners. This collaboration offers veterans, active-duty personnel, Guard and Reserve members, and military and veteran family members robust, holistic assistance to address the unique needs and challenges of our military and veteran community.

OUR STORIES

HFMN handles thousands of calls each year, and each individual or family faces unique challenges. HFMN's experienced case management team understands that a veteran or family member may contact us for a seemingly straightforward reason (e.g., help with rental assistance), but because of the personalized assistance we provide, our team looks beyond the individual's immediate needs to address the whole family's needs, often changing and even saving lives. Below are a few examples of the lives HFMN affected in 2025.

Brad H., an Army Veteran, connected with HFMN after struggling post-transition from the military and suffering significant personal losses. Brad credits his case manager with saving his life, sharing:

"Home Front is an incredible organization. Period. Though small, their staff truly cares about the veterans they support and works tirelessly and passionately to connect them with the right resources that best suit their individual needs and circumstances. They provide ongoing support, follow-ups, and check-ins and make you feel like you matter to them individually on a personal level in a way, that a lot of us vets need in times of crisis and oftentimes don't get, or know where to turn to and ask for that type of care and support. If you're a veteran and in need of any type of support for you, or your family, I could not recommend this organization more."

Rebecca, an Army Veteran, connected with HFMN for financial assistance and received so much more, including a support system. She shared:

"I have got to say this organization saved my life. I was so behind on bills from being stuck in the hospital I was on the verge of becoming another homeless veteran... I was ready to end my life because I felt like such a failure. Home Front was quick and easy. They assisted me through the process. I can't give enough thanks to you all. Thank you so much for actually saving veterans in need."

HFMN PROGRAMS

HFMN programs work to improve outcomes at the individual, program, and system levels. The four primary service areas include:

Navigation

Navigation support for individuals and families with multiple or complex needs or who find the myriad of local services intimidating or overwhelming. We work with these clients to assess and prioritize their needs and help them obtain assistance from multiple agencies, finding services that are the best fit and following alongside them every step of the way, so they do not end up in further crisis and to ensure long-term success. We address the whole family's needs to support family stability, financial and housing stability, and health and well-being.

Financial Bridge Support

Financial Bridge Support is offered through one-time emergency assistance for basic life necessities such as rent/mortgage, utilities, and transportation. The average grant is about \$1,500. Financial assistance helps prevent homelessness, job loss, or other negative impacts and supports long-term financial stability. Relief from financial strain on families helps prevent further family crises and improves mental health and overall health outcomes for individuals and families.

Information & Assistance

Information and Assistance are provided primarily through call-in and web-based services. Our experienced and knowledgeable case management team connects military and veteran individuals and families to services provided by our trusted community partners and other military and veteran resources. Our Network of Care website includes comprehensive service directory links to community, VA, and military resources, a community calendar of military and veteran support events, and more.

Education & Outreach

Education and Outreach through in-person and virtual contacts, such as resource fairs, events, workshops, our website, and social media to ensure service members, veterans, and their families are aware of and can access services available to them. We provide monthly training for our partner agencies, as well as military and VA service providers, to ensure their understanding of military and veteran culture, increase awareness of other agencies' resources to facilitate cross-sector collaboration, and minimize duplication and fragmentation of services. This education, outreach, and collaboration help limit frustrations and ease access for those seeking assistance.

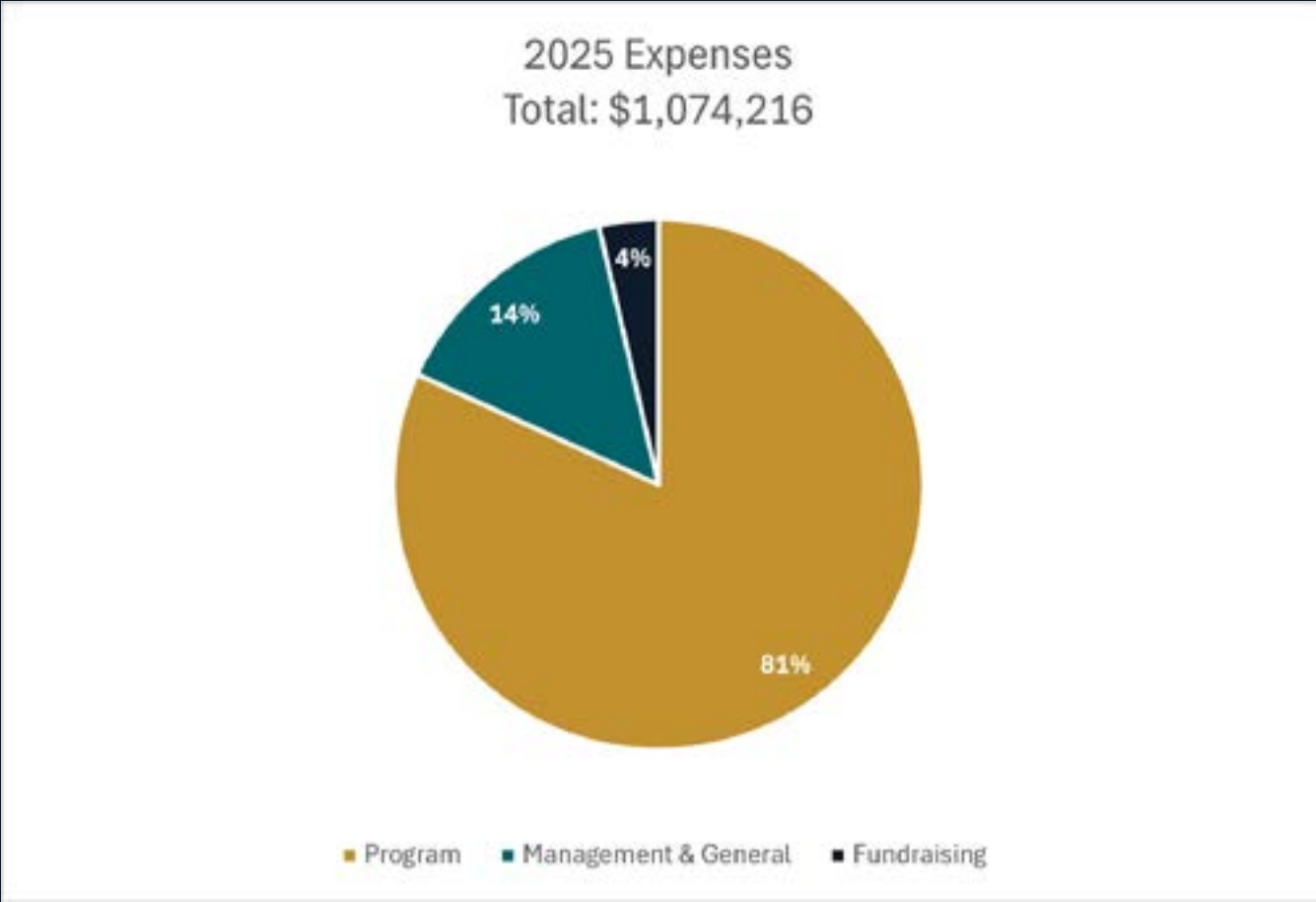
